Some subject will be taught discretely depending on the focus of the chosen theme for the half term. These are indicated with a green border.

Mathematics and PE follow their own scheme of work throughout the year but have some links to the topics covered.

The Year 1 Mathematics topics for the Autumn Term are:

Number: place value	Number: addition and	Geometry: shape

Counting to 10 forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1 of from any given number. Count in multiples of twos. Count, read and write numbers to 10 in numbers and words. Identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations including the number line and use the language of equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most and least. Given a number, identify one more or one less.	Represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts (within 10). Add and subtract one digit numbers (to 10), including zero. Read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs. Solve one step problems that involve addition and subtraction, using concrete objects and pictorial representation is a missing number problem.	Recognise and name of common 2D and 3D shapes including rectangles, squares, circles, triangles, cuboids, pyramids and spheres. Describe position, direction and movement including whole, half, quarter and three quarter turns.

Pupils in Year 1 also have sessions during the week for phonics, guided reading and handwriting.

For Phonics we use the Sounds-Write programme and we start reading with the Dandelion phonic books.
