### Pupil premium progress report - Summer 2017

#### Year 5 (grades December to July)

In Year 5 it's really pleasing to see that the average points score is high all round for the year's progress. Pupil premium pupils have made slightly more progress across the course of the year as an average (4.18 in comparison to 4.15) which has also led to a slightly higher average points score (22.7 in comparison to 22.5).

In Writing the progress is slightly slower (2.62 for pupil premium and 3.13 for none pupil premium) but the overall points scores are similar (22.1 pupil premium and 21.92 none pupil premium). This is with the new higher and more demanding writing standards now in place. Maths is very high in terms of progress (5.18 pupil premium and 5.7 non pupil premium) which shows both the specialist teaching is making impact.

Pupil premium pupils are on average behind non pupil premium pupils for overall attainment (20.42 compared to 22.44) but we are directing support to our pupil premium pupils.

#### Year 6 (grades July to July)

In Year 6 we have both our own data and data generated by the end of Key Stage testing. In both Maths and Reading the standardised average score is slightly higher for non-pupil premium pupils, but not significantly higher. (Maths 101.64 to 100.47), (Reading 99.10 to 98.91). Our own tracking suggests that Maths is also incredibly close and shadows the data supplied through testing. (4.71 points average progress in comparison to 4.73 points for non-pupil premium pupils) overall attainment is also very close (26.42 in comparison to 27.02). In Reading attainment is higher for pupil premium pupils by comparison (27.33 to 26.41) but non pupil premium pupils are making faster progress (4.32 to 3.51). We have continued to use funding to boost our pupil premium pupils in literacy so it's a positive to see this high achievement. Again, in writing we see higher attainment from pupil premium pupils (27.15 points average in comparison to 26.41) but faster progress from non-pupil premium pupils (4.96 to 4.68) the fact that there are such small margins is a testament to the work being done in the school.

#### Year 7 (grades July to July)

Maths in Year 7 has seen pupil premium pupils virtually match non pupil premium pupil's progress (5.26 points to 5.36 points) and attainment (31.73 to 32.44). This reflects well on the interventions and support given to pupil premium students at Westfield. The picture in Writing is similar and the gaps are small in both progress (3.59 to 4.3) and overall attainment (30.24 to 30.87). The only real disparity comes in reading where although attainment isn't particularly different (30.52 to 31.13) the progress has a gap (2.81 to 4.15) so we'll be directing further support into reading within this cohort.

#### Year Eight

Perhaps the biggest validation of the support we have put in place comes in the year group that have spent the most time with us. In Year 8 the pupil premium students are making more rapid progress and have higher attainment on average than their non-pupil premium counterparts. The overall picture is very positive and I think the support for pupil premium is a large factor in this set of results. In Reading, Writing and Maths we see quicker progress (4.74 to 3.91 in Writing, 4.09 to 3.87 in Reading and 4.67 to 2.96 in Maths) and higher attainment (35.39 to 33.28 in Reading, 36.06 to 34.24 in Writing and 35.89 to 35.51 in Maths)
